#### **Connaught School Council Meeting – February 19, 2019 Minutes**

#### 1. Call to Order, Approval of Minutes, Approval of Agenda

- Draft agenda **Approved**
- Minutes from January 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting Approved

### 2. Principal's Report

#### Kindergarten Information Evening

- Originally scheduled for Wednesday January 30<sup>th</sup> and rescheduled to week of February 11<sup>th</sup> due to snow.
- o Lower turn out than expected, possibly due to the rescheduled date.
- Interested families who missed the Information Evening will have an opportunity to attend the May Open House, or may contact Caretta.

#### PD Day – February 15th

- A busy day... which included discussion on coding skills and instruction on health and safety.
- With respect to coding skills, staff acknowledged that they could be considered as important as language skills and that learning should be accessible to all students. The main challenge for incorporating it into the curriculum is the time required to teach and to allow students to practice with applications such as Scratch (a graphical programming language). While Connaught offers the Scratch Club, it only takes place once a week, during recess break, and is limited to juniors.
- Council members asked if some options could be explored for providing coding instruction and practice time during the school day. It was also asked if a computer could be made available to students during break times. Although supervision may be challenging, staff thought it might be possible if an off-line version of Scratch could be installed. Suggestions were also made to explore the use of non-screen related activities to develop computational thinking skills (e.g. Robot Turtle board game). Council will apply for a PRO grant to offer a coding workshop next year.

#### • Mid-Year Budget Update

 Updated spread sheet shared with council members; the school is in a good place this year due, in part, to help from council on activities (e.g. School buses and costs for field trips) and from the school's milk and popcorn fundraisers.

- Water Fountain/Bottle Refilling Station Third Floor
  - The new fountain will cost \$2500. A cost-sharing approach was suggested whereby council would contribute half of the amount.
  - Ask: \$1500 towards the purchase of the new fountain Approved (pending confirmation from Laura).
  - o If approved, Caretta to complete a work order (Form 800) for the board.

### 3. Teacher's Report

Classroom activities:

#### Kinders:

- Post Office and Ancient Egypt (Current Inquiry Topics) Students walked to the post office and mailed letters to their families; discussions on Ancient Egypt are wrapping up and the inquiry into dinosaurs is starting.
- **Black History Month** Classes will welcome Reverend Anthony Bailey from the Parkdale United Church on February 22<sup>nd</sup> to speak about Black History.

#### Primary and Junior:

- **Scientists in Schools** (Grades 3-6) Planned visits for February were rescheduled to March 6<sup>th</sup> due to weather.
- **Indigenous Instruction** (Gr 5) Kareena Butler, Connaught's Indegenous Education Itinerant Instruction Coach visited the class on February 7 for a circle and Community Ties game.
- **Ottawa Art Gallery In-Class Workshop** (Gr 5) Workshop took place at the school on February 22<sup>nd</sup> where students learned about works of art from the Firestone Art Collection which includes paintings, drawings, prints and sculptures by influential Canadian artists from 1890–1985.
- **Marketing Workshop** (Grades 4 & 5) Marketing workshop took place with class's garden tower business partner, Wentsi, from Culture Kombucha.

Extra-curricular activities:

- **Visit with Local Children's Author** (Kinders) Classes had a great visit with popular children's author, Timm Homes. He read his stories to the students and talked about the creative writing process.
- **Have a Heart Day** (Grades 3 & 6 and the Indigenous Ally Alliance) Students prepared a letter voicing their support for First Nations children to have a fair chance to be able to grow up with their families and communities, get a good education and to be healthy and proud of who they are. The planned trip to Parliament Hill on February 14<sup>th</sup> was cancelled due to weather. Instead, Connaught students went to City Hall to read their letter.
- **Snowshoeing, skiing and skating** (Grades 4-6) Some classes will be visiting the *Bill Mason Outdoor Education Centre* on February 21 to participate in a full day cross country ski and snowshoeing programs. Classes are also participating in regular part-day skating sessions at Tom Brown Arena.
- *Winter Activity Day* (all grades) Planned for February 13<sup>th</sup> and rescheduled to February 19<sup>th</sup> due to weather.
- **Volleyball Tournaments** The boys tournament will be taking place on February 21<sup>st</sup>; Girls tournament will be taking place February 28<sup>th</sup>.
