 Principal's Report Principal Kim started with a thank you to the executive for all of their hard work and gave a special mention to staff, students and families for their support of new routines and for everyone's patience, flexibility, perseverance, and positivity. Teachers' Report Culture of sports is being built back up. Grade 6s hosting Terry Fox run and assembly. Donations are coming in (goal is \$1,000 and close to meeting that amount already). XC is back up running (110 kids participating). A convener for soccer are needed. Intermurals may be back on but not being promoted yet/ Grades 3-5 girls targeted Girls on the Run program to promote running (roughly 20 girls can participate). Donations will be school-wide not class-specific Grade 5s involved in student elections (grades 4-6 can cast a ballot) Looking to facilitate World Book Day (March 2nd)	Teacher Representative for September: Louisa Battistelli

Mabel's Labels - started with \$100 cheque for passive fund raiser.	
Pizza - \$20,000 worth of pizza sold to date. 21 students so far identified to receive free pizza through sponsor a slice donations (via online ordering option which has raised \$1,300 so far). Profit expected \$8,000 to be allocated to Library Commons	
Committed Spending	
 Notice board and chalkboard have been committed since 2018. Kim indicated that we are around 9th in the queue for the chalkboard. Quotes are also being put together. Money has been held over for years for this initiative. \$3500 has been put aside for yard renewal (music garden). 	
Summary of Accounts	
 2021: \$12,400 starting balance. By end of year our closing balance was \$18, 271. Raised \$21,643 - a large portion of this was an \$11,000 contribution from Lawn for Connaught. Overall equated to \$60 per student rather than \$15 raised per student the previous year. However we do need to spend as much money as possible in the year it was raised. Pizza day raised \$2,000 (we are set to raise 4x that much). Chapters netted \$1,000 but has been discontinued by Chapters. 	

 We have spent \$1000 (two grants to other schools in our community) and \$1100 towards technology purchases. \$650 towards inclusive books, upgrades to nature education center and staff appreciation lunches. We have 3 years worth of fundraising data but the past few years have been atypical so not so easy to extrapolate from previous years. 	
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Learning Commons Update	
\$25k was the original estimate but freight and soft furniture costs have gone up since the original quote. The original costing estimate has been revised to \$35,000. So far we have spent a little over \$15,000.	
Slide deck presentation of phased purchases. Phase 1 (eg. wobble stools, tables and chairs, mobile circulation desk) and Phase 2 (replacement bookshelves, window bench, standing desk, mobile bookdrop, book cart, music cart).Phase 3 - more modern, soft modular seating will be introduced. Some items already delivered. Expecting remainder of phase 1 and 2 purchases to be delivered in October.	
Library techs are waiting on blinds, projector and floor rugs.	
Julie will look into Best Buy technology grant for library development.	
October - the library walls will be refreshed/repainted white by custodians.
